# FROM THE PRESIDENT

# **Q&As on the Strategic Plan**

Last month, I wrote about council learning that we haven't done a good enough job of communicating and listening to the congregation about the Strategic Plan, and how that has slowed progress on putting it into action.

We've heard some questions and concerns, and I wanted to take some time to speak to some of those things. As always, if you have a question or concern, please contact one of us on council—we're here not to make decisions and lead the church in the vacuum, but to make informed choices that are in the best interest of the congregation and our community. If we don't hear from you, the members of Mt. Carmel, we don't have guidance in how the church moves forward. So, if you have a comment, praise, suggestion, or idea that will help council and the church become a better place and better organization, please share it.

Something I've come to realize is that in talking about changes that the Strategic Plan recommends, some of you are thinking that things we've done in the past are wrong. They aren't. Mt. Carmel wouldn't have lasted for over 90 years if we'd done things the wrong way. At the same time, council knows that all of you who have taught Sunday school, been a money counter, served on Altar Guild, or any of the other groups or committees in our church has knowledge, skills, and experience with all of those things. Instead of saying or thinking that work has been wrong, we recognize that all of that work and experience gives us a stronger foundation to build on because you know what works and what doesn't work.

The Strategic Plan isn't seeking to make change for change's sake—it's to provide a framework that helps us all focus our energies, knowledge and skills to be more impactful in the world. What the Strategic Plan wants us all to do is look at different ways to do the things we've done to see if we can achieve better results or serve more people and ultimately do our best work to serve our mission statement: to Learn, Live and Share God's Word.

I've said it before here and it bears repeating: the only way Mt. Carmel has survived for so many years is to be a living thing. And like all living things, it has changed as it has aged. It's changed as it's needs have changed. And it's changed as its surroundings and community have changed. In the past, these changes have come slowly, forcing us to catch up with our changing environment. But with the Strategic Plan, we hope to be more nimble and dynamic, recognizing changes around us as they happen and able to adapt to them and ensure that the work we do for God in his world is having maximum impact.

All of this comes down to all of you being engaged at some level in your community and in the church. Tell others at church what you're seeing in the world, and what we might be able to do to help serve those in need and bring God's message to northeast Minneapolis. There really aren't wrong ideas, but there are some ideas that won't be as impactful as others.

But we won't know what the best answer is for how to do God's work until more people share more ideas and observations about Mt. Carmel and our community.
