WORSHIP TIME CHANGE

Beginning June 6, Mt. Carmel will return to worshipping at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings.

The first and third Sundays in June are outdoors, and the second and fourth Sundays are indoors. Reservations will be required for indoor, in-person worship. See the article on page 4

INDOOR WORSHIP: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Mt. Carmel will return to in-person, indoor worship on June 13 and June 27. Here's what you need to know:

- Masks and distancing will be required at all times in the building.
- Please perform a self-check for COVID-19 symptoms before coming to church. If you have any symptoms, please stay home.
- Capacity will be limited to 54. Reservations will be required to attend worship. You can reserve your slot beginning June 4 by contacting the office or going here: https://rsvp.church/r/TLwHspGM.
- Enter the church through the main doors on St. Anthony Parkway, leave via the the 31st Avenue door unless you need to use the elevator.
- Communion will be offered using the pre-packaged kits that have been used for our recent outdoor worship services.
- No bus transportation will be available.
- The bathrooms outside of the Fellowship Hall doors will be available.
- There will be no fellowship time following these worship services.
- All services will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook Live.

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Since I began my interim ministry at Mt. Carmel, I have heard some say that it seems like the same people do everything. I know it has been a year and a half since this pandemic began, but now we are moving towards opening in-person worship, meetings, and in all sorts of ways, we need all sorts of volunteers. The church is talking about opening up more and more, which means the need for more and more of you to fill the needs of getting back to in-person ministries.

You may have recognized by now that I love fables. Fables use stories to tell us about our identity without saying exactly what is meant. So here is another favorite which was lovingly shared with the staff at Mt. Carmel.

An elderly Chinese woman had two large pots, each hung on the ends of a pole which she carried across her neck. One of the pots had a crack in it while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water.

At the end of the long walks from the stream to the house, the cracked pot arrived only half full. For a full two years this went on daily, with the woman bringing home only one and a half pots of water.

Of course, the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments. But, the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection, and miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do.

After two years of what it perceived to be bitter failure, it spoke to the woman one day by the stream. "I am ashamed of myself, because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your house."

The old woman smiled, "Did you notice that there are flowers on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I have always known about your flaw, so I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we walk back, you water them."

For two years I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate the table.

Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace the house.

So, to all of my cracked pot friends, have a great day and remember to smell the flowers on your side of the path!

Now, as we prepare to come back together in-person soon, and as the ministry of Mt. Carmel grows, remember, each of us has our own unique flaw. And it's the cracks and flaws we each have that make our lives together so very interesting and rewarding. Let's celebrate each person for what they are and look for the good in them! Thanks be to God!

TASK FORCE UPDATE

The COVID Task Force is excited to announce that we are planning a return to indoor worship on June 13! To help ensure that we are keeping everyone safe as we resume normal church activities, we will be returning in stages. For June, we will have an outdoor worship service on June 6, the indoor worship on June 13, an outdoor service again on June 20 and indoor again on June 27. For these indoor services, we ask that everyone remain masked when in the building and maintain a 6-foot distance between individuals or households.

We will implement a reservation system to ensure that we are not over capacity, and signing up for a slot in this system will be required of all who wish to attend the indoor, in-person worship. There will not be reserved seats, just available spaces for people/households to sit. You may begin reserving your or your household's slots on Friday, June 4 for both indoor services by either contacting the office or going to https://rsvp.church/r/TLwHspGM. If you are able to sign up for a slot in one indoor service, please do not take a slot in the other indoor service to allow everyone to have a chance to attend these services if they wish. All worship services will continue to be livestreamed on Facebook Live.

Communion will be offered using the pre-packaged kits that have been used at the outdoor worship services. There will not be any fellowship time following these services. We ask that everyone attending worship enter through the main door on St. Anthony Parkway, and exit via the 31st Avenue door unless you need to use the elevator. The bathrooms in the hall outside of the elevator and Fellowship Hall will be available for use. Please stay out of areas used by the child care, including the main floor of the education wing, the women's bathroom on that level, and Fellowship Hall. Unfortunately, we will not offer bus transportation for these June services.

We ask that everyone self-assess themselves for COVID symptoms before coming to church on any Sunday we are together, whether indoors or out. If you have any symptoms, please stay home.

The task force will continue to monitor and adjust our response as necessary, and will announce plans for July worship as soon as we are able, but for now, no decision has been made.

We understand that while this return to worship may not be exactly what some people may have hoped for, we ask for your patience and cooperation with the protocols we have put in place. Keep in mind that while you may be fully vaccinated, there will be people attending worship who are not—including children under 12 who are not eligible for the vaccination, so we will continue to mask and distance for those who may still be at risk.

We also understand the desire to stop wearing masks and maintaining distancing. But please keep in mind that while the state has rescinded the mask mandate, at the time of this publication the City of Minneapolis continues its mask mandate, and we must follow that guidance in addition to any additional protocols we feel are necessary.

We hope to be back to a relative normal by the fall, but we need to see increased vaccination numbers and lower infection rates.

There will be more information coming over the next couple of weeks about these services. Please continue to watch the Facebook page, the Candle email and the Sunday announcements.

DO YOU LOVE TECHNOLOGY? WE COULD USE YOUR HELP

As it looks like we may be returning to in-person worship in the near future, we are seeking volunteers to help with the Worship Technology Team

The basic role of the Worship Technology Team will be to help run and support the technology side of worship. During in-person worship, this work includes advancing the slide show, adjusting volume on the microphones and basic troubleshooting before and during the worship service. With our move to livestreaming worship, the team also runs the live-streaming, including setting up the cameras, adjusting the screen as needed, and keeping an eye on any prayers in the live-stream comments.

Once in-person worship resumes, we would ideally have two members of the team for each service. One to run the live-stream and camera, and one to run the sound and slide show. Ideally, we would like eight to 10 people on this team, with the goal of having each person help with worship once a month. We will train everyone on what to do and how to troubleshoot, so no experience is required.

CALLING FOR MOWERS!

Mt. Carmel has a team of drivers that deliver meals for Meals On Wheels (MOW). Many years ago, when our congregation was higher in numbers, there were many drivers available. However, the number has shrunk, and the MOW team is down to seven drivers. For about the last year we have only been responsible for four drivers for one day each month, usually the fourth Friday, but starting in June 2021 we will be switching back to the pre-COVID schedule of Thursday and Friday.

Some details as to what the time commitment is: The time for pick-up of meals is 11:15 a.m. on assigned days. The MOW pick-up location is on Lincoln Street NE (one block west of Johnson St NE), just south of 33rd Ave. NE, at the side entrance of the Waite Park Wesleyan Church. Deliveries can take anywhere from 45 minutes to 1½ hours, depending on how many deliveries there are to make and the distance between deliveries, but usually it doesn't take over an hour. Routes are planned so that deliveries stay within a reasonable delivery area. Insulated bags must be returned to the MOW location on Lincoln St. after deliveries are completed. I send out an email every month to find out who is available to drive, and try to give everyone a break once in a while, if possible.
