# PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Mt. Carmel has been experiencing change and transition for the past year. I hope this is helpful in discovering the difference between change and transition:

Change: Is situational—new job, new boss, new policy, new house, etc.

Transition: The psychological process people go through to come to terms with the new situation. There are three steps to go through in transition.

### Step 1: Endings

The starting point for transitions is not the outcome, but the "ending" we must make to leave the old situation. Think of a big change in your life—new job, marriage, move, birth of a first child etc.

Transition begins with ending, by letting go of something! Think how the change started with an ending. What are those things you had to let go of as a result?

### Step 2: The Neutral Zone

The no-man's land between the old reality and the new; between the old sense of identity and the new. It is a time when the old way is gone and the new doesn't feel comfortable yet.

It's important to understand this "wilderness place" because if you try to rush through it, you will be discouraged when you cannot do so. You may mistakenly conclude that the confusion you feel is a sign that there is something wrong.

You may be frightened and will disengage from the situation. If you escape prematurely, you'll not only compromise the change but also lose a great opportunity.

As painful as it can be, the neutral zone is waiting and listening for God to call you into a new place! This time is the church's best chance for creativity, renewal and development.

### **Step 3: New Beginnings**

People get to the new beginnings only if they have first made an ending and spent some time in the neutral zone.

You have spent a good deal of time in the Neutral Zone. Now, you are moving into New Beginnings. The Transition Team is in place and ready to go to work. The Transition Team's job is to choose a process that will not only change where you are today, but help people make the psychological reorientation that must happen if this transition is to work. Please keep the Transition Team in your prayers (Karen Matthes, Steve Ristuben and Sinéad Carolan).

# **COVID TASK FORCE UPDATE**

As we head into October, we continue to be cautious while still allowing activities in the church building.

As a reminder, we continue to require everyone to wear masks when in the building to work, volunteer, worship or gather, unless you are doing a task on your own in a closed room. We ask that you continue to keep a safe distance between you and others during events and meetings, and avoid going into the childcare areas.

The delta variant is a difficult version of this virus: it's more infectious, can be carried and transmitted by those who are vaccinated, and has been shown to be more dangerous to those who become infected with it, including children. While we know that most of our members have been fully vaccinated, we know that the children of our church aren't yet eligible, and while our current precautions are primarily to keep them safe when they are in the building, they are also to minimize the risk to everyone. For children's and youth events, we are continuing to watch guidance from government agencies and paying attention to how the area's schools are responding.

The good news is that we are slowly adding back suspended services or functions, most notably the resumption of bus service on Sundays. Masks must be worn on the bus for safety, but we thank and appreciate the drivers for agreeing to resume the service.

As booster shots are approved and available, we encourage those eligible to get them, and we anxiously look forward to the day we can all be in the building together, safely vaccinated as an entire congregation.

Aug. 31, 2021

Mt. Carmel finances continue to be in the red. We are still ahead of our budgeted deficit, but need to faithfully continue our work towards erasing this deficit.
