Dear Mt. Carmel members and visitors,

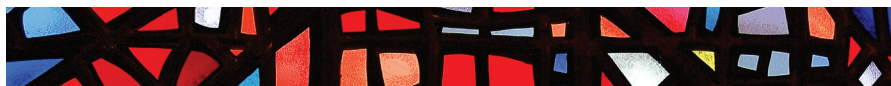

MOUNT CARMEL CHURCH IN MINNEAPOLIS FOUNDATION

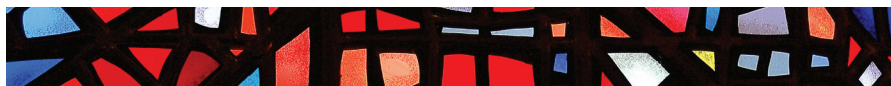

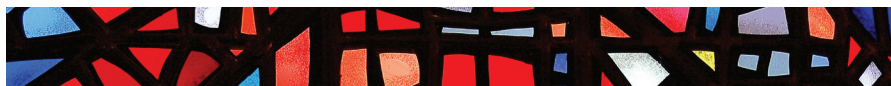

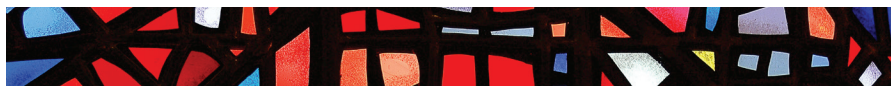

SUNDAY SCHOOL

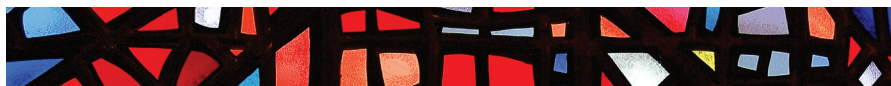
The Sunday School program at Mt. Carmel provides children an opportunity to learn about the love of God, the Christian faith, community and worship. Volunteer leaders are always welcome.

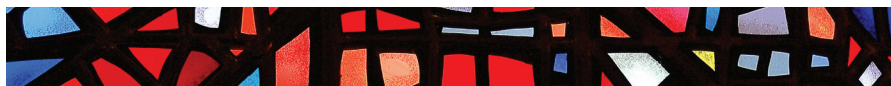

SCOUTS BSA TROOP 132 (BOYS & GIRLS)

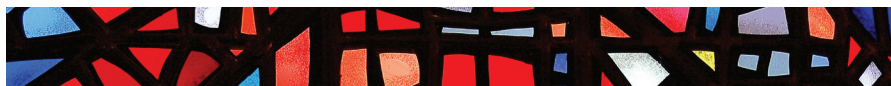

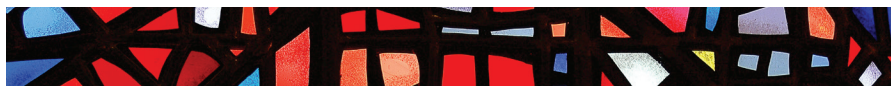
NORTHSIDE JUSTICE FELLOWSHIP

COMMUNION SERVERS

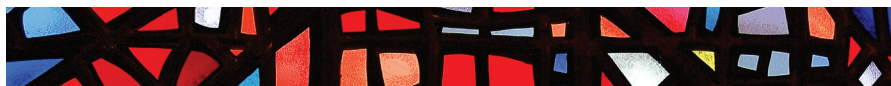

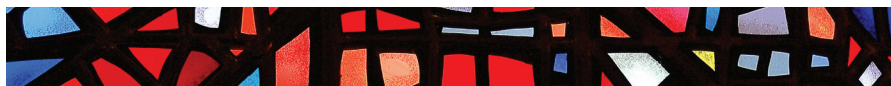
SANCTUARY CHOIR
