COVID TASK FORCE UPDATE

The COVID-19 Task Force is happy to report that after 29 months of work, we have concluded our work as a task force.

Community infection numbers and immunization availability in addition to our members' cooperation with our risk mitigation efforts have made this possible, and we're pleased to say that effective immediately, we are removing any remaining restrictions.

This means that food service can return to pre-pandemic standards, communion servers no longer need to wear gloves, and that mask use, while encouraged, is still optional. Staff will be asked to isolate for at least 5 days if they test positive, following CDC guidelines (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/isolation.html).

As we return to our pre-pandemic standards, we want to urge everyone to continue to be aware of their health and monitor themselves for symptoms. At this time of year, this includes monitoring for symptoms of colds and flu in addition to COVID, and staying home if you feel you have symptoms of any of those viruses.

Many public health officials have been urging everyone to make sure they are up to date on their vaccinations, especially for the flu and with the new generation of bivalent COVID vaccines. We echo this in order to keep everyone in our congregation, schools, workplaces, families and friend groups healthy throughout Minnesota's fall and winter months. Check the CDC's guidance on immunizations to help determine if you are eligible.

As we've said throughout the last two-plus years, we appreciate everyone's cooperation with the COVID restrictions. We understand that it hasn't been an easy time for anyone, and we recognize that it has been a struggle for many of you.

On a personal note, I'd like to thank the members of the task force for their time and efforts. It hasn't been easy to research and digest all of the rapidly changing data and guidance over the last two years. We've had to make some difficult decisions and enforce the restrictions that we decided on, even in the face of negative sentiment from some members of the congregation who disagreed with our decisions. All of the actions we took and decisions we made were made with an abundance of caution to help protect every one of our members and everyone in our community.

When we started meeting, like many of you at the time, most of us thought our work would wrap up within months. Alas, we've had to remain active for years, and as we do I want to express my appreciation for the dedication to our work by the members of the task force the last two years: Diane Langer, Rich Feist, Lynette Dubbels, Pastor Christine, Jenni Lathrop and Pastor John.

NEWS FROM THE PEWS

We all know that Mt. Carmel has very talented people in our congregation and **Trina Benedict** is one of them! Trina's talent is sewing and creative design. Her aunt taught her to sew at the age of 11. Trina was a stitcher for the Guthrie Theater from 1998-2004. She then went to the U of M for her Master of Fine Arts in costume design and technology. The technology part includes draping (which is pattern making), tailoring, millinery, costume crafts and painting/dyeing. After graduation, Trina worked for the Guthrie as a draper. She now works as a draper for the Minnesota Opera and a costume designer for the Medora Musical and The Church Basement Ladies plays.



When Trina designs and works as a draper, there is a lot of research of the time period the play or opera is set in. For example, for the Church Basement Ladies plays, Trina uses old Montgomery Wards and Sears catalogs. She also uses old yearbooks and church directories of the '50s thru the '70s.

Trina's mother Janet Martin has been a great influence on her. Her mother is the author of "The Church Basement Ladies" (over one million people have seen the plays). Trina says that her mother's gumption and energy are inspiring but, more importantly, she says that her mother taught her to do what she loves and that putting in the hard work can lead to a happy and satisfying career.

Trina and her husband Andy joined Mt. Carmel in 2008 and have four children, Nora, Frida, Martin and Jens.

TREASURER REPORT: AUG. 31, 2022

Congratulations again on meeting the matching funds challenge. As of Aug. 31, special gifts towards matching funds provided by Mt. Carmel Foundation reached \$25,736.86.

We did experience a decline in our regular contributions this month not meeting budgeted income. However, with the Foundation matching funds contribution; our August income was over the budgeted income by \$380.45. Our expenses were also under budget this month.

The congregation faithfully passed a deficit budget of (\$62,709.00) at the annual meeting, and with the Mt. Carmel Foundation's support, has remained on a steadfast path month after month towards meeting the challenge of erasing this deficit budget. We still have challenges, but have been blessed with answers, and a potential for a positive year end.
