# TREASURER REPORT: FEB. 1, 2023

Mt. Carmel is facing a challenging year once again, with a 2023 deficit budget faithfully passed by the congregation to the amount of (\$43,368.00).

I want to point out that last year at this time we faced a deficit budget of (\$62,709.00). After receiving many blessings, including additional giving by our congregation of \$35,156, we ended 2022 with a positive of \$19,170.30 which was carried forward into 2023.

The Mt. Carmel Foundation has pledged an initial gift of \$6,100 for specified areas of the budget. In addition, they will gift up to an additional \$5,000 in a \$1 for \$2 matching fund challenge for all special gifts above pledged giving by June 30. Meaning: If we raise \$10,000 in additional special gifts, the Foundation is gifting an additional \$5,000. With the Mt. Carmel Foundation gifts, we potentially could erase \$21,100 of the deficit by June 30.

Challenges bring answers and we are again blessed with potential for a positive year end. Join in the excitement to help reach the 20231 for 2 Challenge for matching funds.

# FEBRUARY COUNCIL NOTES

- A big welcome to our new council members: Kathy Halvorson and Patrick Kutzer. They join our current Council members: Doug Jones, Dave Larson, Karen Moeller, Al Erickson, and Lory Dubbels.
- The following people were elected officers: Karen Moeller, president; Al Erickson, vice president; Lory Dubbels, secretary and Diane Langer was appointed treasurer.
- Installation of the council will be on Sunday, Feb 19.
- Pastor Steve Olson's last day of preaching will be Feb 26. Pastor Dave Olson will preach March 5 and 12.
- An invitation will be extended to Pastor "C" to attend our March 14 council meeting even though he hasn't started at Mt. Carmel yet.

Thank you to Matt Nordeen, who has faithfully served as treasurer these last years, and will continue into 2023 as he assists Sue Feist into her transition to the role

The mission of the Foundation is to receive gifts, invest them prudently and distribute interests from the income for religious, benevolent, charitable and educational activities not generally budgeted by the church council. In special situations, money may also be distributed from the capital fund.

In January 2023, the Foundation approved the following grants: \$6,100 to be used for the specified elements of faith formation, evangelism, and worship and music in the 2023 church budget, and up to \$5,000 to sponsor a one-for-two matching fund challenge to be granted to church for the purpose of erasing the deficit budget. Any special gifts above pledged will be matched. For example, a donation of \$10 will be matched with an additional \$5 to result in a \$15 donation.

The challenge is to raise \$10,000 by June 30 and the Foundation will add an additional \$5,000 to make \$15,000 in special funds raised.

We are excited and hopeful to see all of this grant utilized by the deadline. Please consider a special gift to Mt. Carmel and join the "One for Two Challenge." Note the special gift on your check or envelope.
