# FROM THE PASTOR

It's the Easter season. From the early days of the Church, those baptized on Easter were prepared (catechesis "to whisper in the ear") during the season of Lent, but not overly instructed about what the rites meant and about what to expect at their baptism. Sacraments are symbolic, after all, with many levels of meaning for all. The saying goes that "experience is a hard teacher because she gives the test first and the lesson afterward." In that spirit the baptized received the experience of Easter baptism first, and in these seven weeks that followed they were to be at the foot of the pulpit (at the foot of the bishop, actually) and these Sunday gospel stories were (and still are) specially chosen to teach them about their new life in Christ. They were taught about "the mysteries" that before baptism were withheld from them. Now they have participated in the mysteries of Easter, of dying and rising, of holy baptism and holy communion. Now was the time for "mystogical catechesis" to use its fancy word.

So we'll spend these seven Easter weeks exploring the mysteries of the faith and remembering what it means to be baptized, initiated, as God's co-workers in bringing in the reign of God.

- · EASTER 1—The resurrection is announced
- EASTER 2—Jesus is merciful with doubters and those who struggle to understand (Thomas)
- EASTER 3—Jesus appears on the journey/road and in the breaking of the bread (Emmaus)
- EASTER 4—Jesus is the good shepherd
- EASTER 5—Jesus is the way, truth and life, going before us to prepare to receive us
- EASTER 6—Jesus is our advocate
- EASTER 7—Jesus is our high priest and prays and cares for us—or—Jesus is present in all times and places (Ascension)
- PENTECOST—Jesus sends the Holy Spirit of his resurrection upon us

One way we'll do that is to invite families and anyone who wishes to join us in a Holy Communion workshop for those children in our community who have been invited into the mystery, but now with that "experience," would benefit from a "lesson" about this sacrament. See the faith formation announcements for more about this opportunity.

Our Old Testament "first readings" on Sundays are replaced with "Readings from the Early Church" all coming from the second volume of Luke's gospel, Acts of the Apostles. Only in the Easter season do we replace our history stories from the old covenant with those of the new covenant.

And did you ever wonder what the difference is between a disciple and an apostle? *Disciple* means follower. But *apostle* means sent ones. The Easter weeks are for learning, relearning or discovering what it means that we are no longer followers but sent ones... sent out from the Easter mysteries into a world desperately in need of resurrection.

So that's what I think we're up to in the next few weeks. Read on to see what else we're up to this spring in our corner of the Kingdom of God on St. Anthony Parkway.

# TREASURER UPDATE YTD: APRIL 15

Mt. Carmel continues on a positive road towards our goal to erase our faithfully passed deficit budget of (\$43,368.00)

A reminder that we again have opportunities available as an avenue to recover. The Mt. Carmel Foundation has pledged an initial gift of \$6,100 for specified areas of the budget. In addition, they will gift up to an additional \$5,000 in a \$1 for \$2 matching fund challenge for all special gifts above pledged giving by June 30. This means if we raise \$10,000 in additional special gifts, the Foundation is gifting an additional \$5,000.

With the Mt. Carmel Foundation gifts, we potentially could erase \$21,100 of the deficit by June 30.

Special Gifts raised year to date are \$3840. The balance remaining to reach \$10,000 to receive the Foundation match \$6160. Challenges bring answers! Join in the excitement to help reach the 2023 1 for 2 Challenge.
