READING FROM THE EARLY CHURCH

Jesus sends the apostles

Acts 1:1–11

Before he is lifted into heaven, Jesus promises that the missionary work of the disciples will spread out from Jerusalem to all the world. His words provide an outline of the book of Acts.

Luke writes:

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ²until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

The risen and exalted Christ reigns over the entire universe. The author of Ephesians prays that we would be given the wisdom to comprehend this and display it through love toward others.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus

Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power.

²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²²And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Great feast that Easter is, one day (or even Three Days!) is insufficient to celebrate the fullness of the joy and mystery of the resurrection. So, as Christians, we keep a fifty-day-long festival, punctuated forty days in by our celebration of the Ascension of our Lord—the fortieth day of Easter. Ascension, like a prism, helps us focus the wondrous colors of the Easter spectrum.

The images from Ascension worship give us a sense of the hope and joy that color this feast: "Christ's ascension is our glory and hope." "The joy of the resurrection and the ascension renews the whole world." "Where Christ has gone, we hope to follow." "Christ has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us, but to be our hope." "Christ was taken up to heaven to claim for us a share in his divine life."

Through these Easter days, the assisting minister has been sending us out into the world with the Easter message, "Go in peace. Share the good news!" We go to the font only once in our lives, and we go to the altar for an hour or so each week. The rest of the time is spent outside the church doors, but still in Christ, as Christ, to our world today. To this we say, "Thanks be to God!"

If we have been united with Christ through baptism in his death and resurrection, we are surely united with him in his transformation and redemption of the world. What we celebrate, however, is not only a past or future event. We are given glimpses of God's Reign breaking in even now. So, feet firmly planted on earth, the community gathers to rejoice in the life we share with the risen Lord. "Go in peace. Share the good news!"

Pentecost is next Sunday

Easter reaches its fullness next Sunday as we celebrate the 50th day, the Spirit's day, birthday of the church, Confirmation, great Pentecost! What began in cold ashes, what was washed with water and oiled with gladness and nourished with bread and wine now is filled with breath and stirred aflame. Breathe deeply this week; let every breath be a prayer. Play the flute or the kazoo. Hang wind chimes to catch God's breath. Fly a kite. Be on fire; live passionately. Read a love poem. Challenge someone to act on behalf of the common good. Take a stand against a grave injustice. Light seven candles on the dinner table. Wear red. Eat strawberries (if you're not allergic). Sing! Fifty days of Easter have been given for our delight and for our celebration. Rejoice and be glad!
