Isaiah 43:1-7

When you pass through the waters, do not fear, for I am with you Near the end of Israel's exile in Babylon, God promises to bring them home. They need no longer be afraid, because the one who formed, created, and called them by name now redeems them from all their enemies. God declares them precious and honored, and God loves them.

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel:

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

²When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

SECOND READING

Acts 8:14-17

Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the good news of Christ through the preaching of Philip. Here the Samaritans receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the laying on of hands.

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶(for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

GOSPEL

John's preaching and baptism of Jesus Luke 3:15-17, 21-22 The reading opens with questions about the identity of the Messiah. John the Baptist insists that he is not the Messiah; instead he points ahead to one who is coming. And whether the voice of God was heard by all or only by Jesus, God settles the matter: Jesus is God's beloved Son.

WORSHIP LIFE

Epiphany Revelation

The word "Epiphany" translates as *manifestation* or *revelation*. It refers to the unfolding of the identity of the Messiah or Christ, "anointed one."

SEASONAL THEME

We walk in the brightness of the beloved Son. In that spirit we gather under the star and in the growing light of the sun as the days lengthen. We heard John the baptizer say this year. "John testified to him and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'" (Jn 1:15) and so after Christmas and the solstice, the days lengthen, the nights shorten, and Jesus increases as John decreases. The sun outshines the moon. Jesus Christ, the morning star, the light of the world.

PROGRESSION OF REVELATIONS of who Jesus is

There are six Sundays between the Epiphany of Our Lord and the beginning of Lent this year. From week to week the scriptures reveal the person and work of Jesus. But they also reveal what it means to be a Christian today. The scriptures invite us to see Jesus and continue his ministry in our own age.
