SECOND READING

Jesus' ministry after his baptism

Acts 10:34–43

*Peter crosses the sharp religious boundary separating Jews from Gentiles and
proclaims the good news of God's inclusive forgiveness in Jesus' name to*

Cornelius, a Roman centurion. As a result of Peter's preaching, Cornelius and his family become the first Gentiles to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]:

"I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him.

³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all.

³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

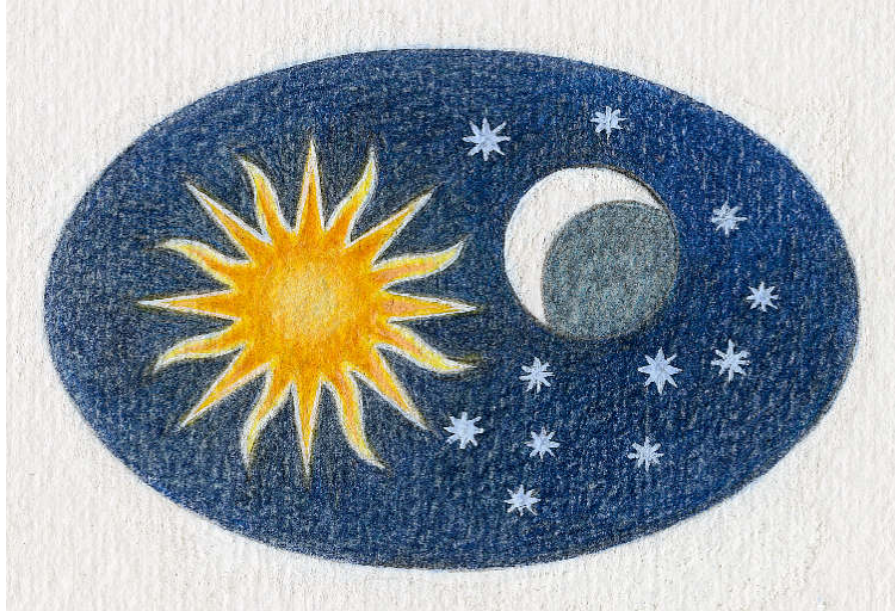

WORSHIP LIFE

Epiphany Revelation

The word “Epiphany” translates as *manifestation* or *revelation*. It refers to the unfolding of the identity of the Messiah or Christ, “anointed one.”

SEASONAL THEME

We walk in the brightness of the beloved Son. In that spirit we gather under the star and in the growing light of the sun as the days lengthen. John the baptizer says. “This was he of whom I said, ‘He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.’” (Jn 1:15) and so after Christmas and the solstice, the days lengthen, the nights shorten, and Jesus increases as John decreases. The sun outshines the moon. Jesus Christ, the morning star, the light of the world.

PROGRESSION OF REVELATIONS of who Jesus is

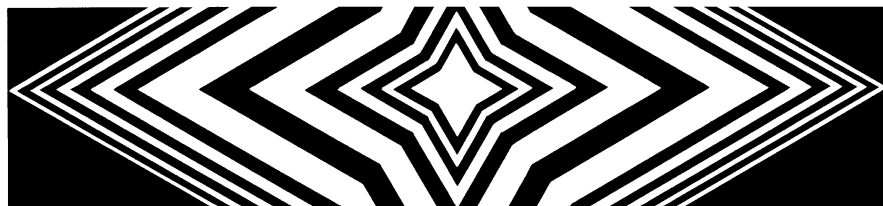
